THE PROJECT

Streetohome is partnering with TPD, an international Workforce and HR Solutions company, to incubate Work With Us - a new non-profit foundation seeking national charitable status in Canada. More than 500 marginalized individuals will be supported with employment opportunities and the organization fully intends to be self-sustaining without additional public or private investment. This work will build on the success of the Galt Foundation which TPD has successfully introduced in Eugene, Salem and Portland, Oregon and Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Galt Foundation currently employs more than 2500 individuals with disabilities and other vocational barriers.

WHY EMPLOYMENT?

Research consistently shows that people who have experienced homelessness want to work and that a substantial portion can secure and retain jobs. Unfortunately, stigmas (feelings of being perceived by others as incompetent, lazy, unmotivated) are barriers to employment and disrupt performance in work settings. Motivation enhancement training, based on insights from behavioural economics and cognitive and social psychology (and empirically shown to change the way individuals cope with employment challenges), will enhance the adaptation of the Galt model in Canada. With the appropriate supports, individuals have been shown to overcome barriers to thrive and succeed in the workplace.
