



Breaking the Cycle

Change doesn't always come easy for individuals who feel they have limited options. Some individuals struggle to make a living and may supplement their income by resorting to crime. Many are arrested and released into homelessness repeatedly, stuck in a "revolving door" scenario that is costly in terms of public health and safety, financial losses, and ensuing police, court, and incarceration expenses. Delancey Street prevents and breaks this cycle.

The Delancey Street Vancouver

Delancey Street provides an attractive, empowering opportunity for vulnerable individuals to **lead, learn and earn.** Participants develop a mutual concern for one another, and accountability is emphasized in terms of acknowledging mistakes, taking responsibility for one's actions, and growing from it.

There are 23,000 successful graduates from six locations across the U.S. Delancey Street is a proven member-led model that combines life skills, housing, education, and vocational training. Each member graduates with a high school equivalency, three marketable skills and a motivation to forge a new path.

A Place to Lead, Learn and Earn

Streetohome is brokering the purchase of a 2.77-acre property for the **flagship Delancey Street in Canada**. The site can accommodate sufficient housing and vocational training schools.

The property is located in a quiet neighbourhood, close to amenities and centrally located in the Lower Mainland. It has a hotel, restaurant, and store co-located on the property. Once purchased, Delancey Street leadership will be joined by three U.S. graduates on work visas to establish a foundational culture. Intake will be limited to 30 members at the start and scale up to 100+.

Revenues from Delancey Street's vocational training schools (e.g., moving & trucking; catering, restaurant & café; and handcrafts) are sufficient to cover the costs of housing, food, personal items, life skills development, health, education, and vocational training of members. A key feature of the model is that there is **no cost to government, families, or individuals**.

The cost for the property is \$15M and \$3M operations seed funding is required to ensure sufficient time for the vocational training schools to be established. Streetohome has already received a pledge of \$6M. **\$12M is required** to complete the purchase of the property and launch the Delancey Street program.

The Dynamic Force

Delancey Street is celebrating 50 years of helping individuals turn their lives around and has garnered international attention. Dr. Mimi Silbert, President & CEO, leads Delancey Street's six U.S. locations, and now the flagship in Canada. Her tenacious spirit and unlimited energy helped her realize her vision for an educational community for individuals to break their destructive cycles and take responsibility for themselves and others.
